



## Plant Suggestions for Glyndon Trace Villas

### ***Upright Evergreens to be used in corners or Replacements for the Green Giant Arbovitea, existing Junipers or tight areas.***

- **Emerald Green Arbovitea**- Arborvitae Emerald Green grows to a height of 10 to 15 feet, with a spread of 3 to 4 feet. The Emerald Green Arborvitae displays its bright lustrous emerald green color all year, and does not discolor in winter. 'Emerald Green' arborvitae does fine in full sun, but can grow in light shade as well. the Emerald Green Arborvitae grows almost perfectly pyramidal with hardly any pruning needed.



- **Steeds Upright Holly**-An easy to grow, densely branched evergreen shrub with an interesting pyramidal form. Lustrous dark green foliage adds color to the landscape year-round. Black berries last all winter on female plants.

**Spartan Juniper**- This juniper variety has a fast growing, dense, narrow columnar growth habit - tapers ever so slightly in width from the base on up to the point. Its foliage is a rich green all year around. No trimming or pruning needed - very hardy, tough plant. Fast Growing.





## Plant Suggestions for Glyndon Trace Villas

### ***Evergreens for beneath Window's or Foundation Plants.***

**-Otto Lutken Cherry Laurels-** Do well in full sun or partial shade, and 'Otto Luken's" even tolerate deep shade. White blooms appear mid-spring *Do not* prune by sheering around the edges to a perfect but unnatural shape – this will lead to dead interior problems as well as disease and pest.



**Winter Gem Boxwoods-** . Excellent evergreen shrub for small hedges. The Winter Gem is an ideal shrub for a formal garden. It grows in full sun or partial shade. It takes to shearing and pruning quite well.

**Manhattan Euyonmous**-This shrub has a neat formal appearance. Dark green leaves back attractive pinkish fruit. . Manhattan Euyonmous can be sheared and pruned regularly to maintain desired height. Also, can be dormant pruned early spring to rejuvenate new growth.





## Plant Suggestions for Glyndon Trace Villas

### ***Border plants- Small plants or perennials for along borders of landscape beds***

**-Big Blue Liriope** - Grass-like perennial which typically grows 12-18" high with dark green leaves (1" wide). Erect, showy flower spikes with tiered whorls of dense, lavender flowers that rise just above the leaves in late summer. Flowers give way in fall to blackish berries which often persist into winter. Tolerate to a wide range of light conditions. Also tolerates heat, humidity and drought. Can also be used as ground cover. Mow in early spring to remove old foliage.



**-Moonbeam Coreopsis**- Flowers heavily from June through August, with repeat bloom till frost. 'Moonbeam' is one of those rare plants that can't be used badly. It makes a superb front-of-the-border plant. Prune back early Spring





## Plant Suggestions for Glyndon Trace Villas

**Blue Shore Juniper-** Wonderful, low spreading form makes a superb groundcover, group planting or single specimen. Dense blue green foliage gives this selection a handsome appearance and is best when left unsheared.. Variety is very heat tolerant. Evergreen.





## Plant Suggestions for Glyndon Trace Villas

### ***Flowering shrubs to be used in between foundation shrubs and border plants.***

**Knockout Roses**-Knock Out Roses come in a variety of different colors. Blooms from Spring until Frost .A once a year cut (to about 12-18" above the ground) in early spring (after the last hard frost) is also recommended for maximum performance.



**Little Princess Spirea**- A small-mounded shrub with fine-textured foliage. Numerous, pink flowers in flat-topped clusters in late spring to midsummer. Requires minimal pruning.

**Gulfstream Nandina-** Gulf Stream Nandinas are moderately growing evergreen shrubs. Gulf Streams are excellent accent bushes for people looking for red in their landscape.
